LKSUD Water Department Notice

The LKSUD has over \$21 million needed replacements for our current water lines and a possible future new well. The cost to replace the remaining water lines on the East side of Lake Kiowa is currently estimated to be \$14 million. These water lines are over 50 years old and subject to leakage at an ever-increasing rate. The LKSUD board voted to begin Phase 5 of the water line replacement at an estimated cost of \$\$6.2 million.

Various agencies of the State of Texas mandate that the Lake Kiowa Special Utility District provide safe drinking water to their residents along with a safe and reliable distribution system to facilitate this mandate. The Greater Texoma Utility Authority is responsible for the issuance and repayment of bonds necessary for our water line replacement projects. It was with their guidance and recommendation that 2025 water rates were established.

This is due to the cost of replacing the water lines on the East Side, for which a bond has been approved. You will be receiving notification from the LKSUD around the first of December regarding their plans.






Lake Kiowa Line Dancers








lection drive and our Wreaths Across America Ceremony.

faces as they used fishing poles to capture prizes. The Clean Up Our Lake initiative, which was held on Saturday, November 9, was our first


















KWC Program



Read a Book, Share a Book, Leave a Book



Did You Know...

That the Score Differential formula in the new World Handicap System (WHS) contains an adjustment for playing conditions? It's called, wait for it, the playing conditions calculation (PCC). The Score Differential formula is (113/Slope Rating) x (adjusted gross score – Course Rating – PCC). It's then your best eight of twenty Score Differentials that determines your Handicap Index. Since Course Ratings are based on normal playing conditions, PCC is an automatic calculation that determines whether playing conditions on a given day differed enough from normal to warrant a Score Differential adjustment.

So how does PCC know to make an adjustment? At the end of each day, the playing conditions calculation takes place automatically to determine if scores made at the course were significantly higher or lower than expected. As we all know, scores can be affected by playing conditions, primarily weather and course setup. PCC compares the scores from at least eight players with a Handicap Index of 36 or below that are submitted on a given day against expected scoring patterns. If the scores for a given day are better or worse than expected, PCC will make an adjustment of -1 to +3 to everyone's differential who played that day. A negative (-) adjustment means the course played easier than expected and a positive (+) adjustment means the course played more difficult than expected. A PCC of 0 means the course played as expected, which will be the case on most days. There is a separate column for PCC in your GHIN scoring record, so you'll know if a PCC was applied on a particular day.

As of the end of October 2024, Lake Kiowa has had six PCC adjustments. Five of the six were a -1 for an easier course setup. The sixth was a significant +3 adjustment on Sunday of the Kapers meaning that the course played much more difficult than normal on the last day of the MGA's Member/Guest tournament.

To summarize, PCC makes an up or down adjustment to your Score Differential to ensure your Handicap Index isn't skewed by abnormal playing conditions and remains a true reflection of your demonstrated ability. As always, if you have a question, ask any member of...





Golf Course Maintenance Report

The growing season is essentially over. Over the past few weeks, we have started shifting our focus from routine maintenance to preparing the golf course for winter dormancy. In September, we began regular foliar fertilizer applications to greens with more potassium being applied. Increased potassium helps the plant store carbohydrates that it will need to tolerate low temperatures over the winter.

Overall, the turf in all areas of the golf course is in good shape going into dormancy.

This is a reminder that golf carts have been restricted to CART PATH ONLY since December 1 and will remain that way through winter. Golfers that need blue flags will NOT be restricted to cart paths unless they are due to weather.

Although the routine mowing will be reduced significantly, there is still plenty to do over the winter, and we will continue to stay busy. Our main focus over the next few weeks will be to try and stay on top of all the leaves that have dropped. We will keep our rough mowers moving through the golf course mulching those leaves as they fall.

During this time of year, I keep a very close eye on the weather forecast. If the low temperatures are forecast to stay below freezing for more than 24 consecutive hours or the overnight low temperature is below 25 and the next day high will not reach 40 degrees, then we will cover the greens. If we have to cover the greens, I will be sure to communicate that to the community.

Happy Holidays!

Please continue to fill your divots and fix ball marks. It is just as or even more important this time of the year as it is in the spring and summer.

Other Areas: Seal coating applied to San Chez, Hogan Dr., Mohawk CV, Texas CV, and several other roads

Patch Work: A total of 10,008 sq. ft. of road patching was completed.

Crack filling, in combination with seal coating, is essential for long-term pavement protection. Preventive maintenance like this helps ensure our roads stay in great shape for years to come.


